
We had a good meeting in August. Two new members joined.

I ran across a Sturgis Program from 1987. An article about the history of the White Plate Flat Trackers Association drew my attention. It goes on to explain that the WPFT Assn. was formed with the primary intention of establishing a permanent listing and short history of expert riders in years prior to 1970. It is planned to update this listing and eventually have a record of all the top expert racers in the world. Although the magazine doesn't say who wrote the article, it mentions many quotes from J. C. "Pappy" Hoel. He said "The idea started with Al Burke." The two had been talking about some of the men who had qualified for the white plate, and Hoel decided to form the association in order to record their accomplishments. An organizational meeting was held August 7 with all those attending receiving the honor of being charter members of the association. At that time, the president of the organization was Bob Moore, Treasurer Helen Miller. The Board of Directors includes executive director Don Vodden, and members Don Rice, J.C. Hoel, Al Burke, Kenneth Allaman, Dan Deubler, Pat McHenry, Jim Spirk, Norm Tietz, and Al Nelson. There were 112 members. Also the article talks about the "Blue Note Book" that contains the original "application for membership" forms.
